Transcript of Video Message from CEO Duncan Niederauer to NYSE Euronext Employees (January 11, 2012):

Good morning everybody. It's Wednesday morning in New York, and once again we find our proposed merger in the news today, so I wanted to make sure that all of you heard from me directly with a little more context around what's been spoken about in the last 24 hours, and some thoughts on the weeks ahead.

I want to be very clear: we have not received a formal decision from DG Competition, but it certainly appears, if you look at all the news reports, that the preliminary conclusion they have reached will be to recommend that the proposed merger with DB be prohibited.

If that's true, I would have to say that's a pretty disappointing conclusion, but I would also add that that conclusion could only be based on the concerns that the case team raised in their initial statement of objections. Specifically, their assertions are that the derivatives industry is not global and that the OTC and Exchange Traded Derivatives Markets are not converging and therefore do not compete.

I have to tell you I think that's a conclusion that results from a fundamentally flawed technical analysis that ignores the realities of the marketplace that we live and work in every day. As The Financial Times reported last week, the fact that the derivatives industry is global is "blindingly obvious." I also thought that the Mercedes/BMW analogy in this morning's FT article was similarly compelling.

So what's next? Where do we go from here the next few weeks?

As we said in our statement yesterday, under the European Commission's formal process, any preliminary recommendation by the case team is subsequently vetted and acted on by the entire European Commission.

So over the next few weeks we're going to continue to press our case directly with various Commissioners in the EU, both to highlight the serious flaws in the case team's core argument, and to ensure that there is a clear understanding of the strong benefits that our combination will bring to a broad set of stakeholders in Europe.

As we've talked about before, these benefits are real: €3 billion in capital efficiencies for clients and more than €2 billion in annual cost-savings for end users. It's precious capital that can be redeployed into the real economy of Europe at this

critical juncture.

I'll keep you posted as we head into the final few weeks here. Thanks for your patience, thanks for your continued hard work, and I'll see you out there.

(“**Holding**”), a newly formed holding company, filed, and the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (“**SEC**”) declared effective on May 3, 2011, a Registration Statement on Form F-4 with the SEC that includes (1) a proxy statement of NYSE Euronext that also constitutes a prospectus for Holding, which was used in connection with NYSE Euronext special meeting of stockholders held on July 7, 2011 and (2) an offering prospectus used in connection with Holding’s offer to acquire Deutsche Börse AG shares held by U.S. holders. Holding has also filed an offer document with the German Federal Financial Supervisory Authority (*Bundesanstalt für Finanzdienstleistungsaufsicht*) (“**BaFin**”), which was approved by the BaFin for publication pursuant to the German Takeover Act (*Wertpapiererwerbs-und Übernahmegesetz*), and was published on May 4, 2011. The acceptance period for the exchange offer expired on midnight, at the end of July 13, 2011 (Central European Daylight Savings Time), the additional acceptance period for the exchange offer expired on midnight, at the end of August 1, 2011 (Central European Daylight Savings Time). Pursuant to Section 39c of the German Takeover Act, shareholders of Deutsche Börse who had not yet accepted the exchange offer were still able to do so until midnight at the end of November 4, 2011 (Central European Time).

Investors and security holders are urged to read the definitive proxy statement/prospectus, the offering prospectus, the offer document, as amended, and published additional accompanying information in connection with the exchange offer regarding the proposed business combination transaction because they contain important information.
