Item 6. Indemnification of Directors and Officers.

The Certificate of Incorporation (the Charter) and the Bylaws of the Registrant provide in effect that the Registrant shall indemnify its directors and officers (as well as persons serving as a director or officer of any of the Registrant's direct or indirect subsidiaries) to the extent permitted by the General Corporation Law of the State of Delaware (the DGCL). Sections 102 and 145 of the DGCL provide that a Delaware corporation has the power to indemnify its directors, officers, employees and agents in certain circumstances, as described below.

In accordance with Section 102 of the DGCL, the Registrant's Charter contains a provision that eliminates the personal liability of directors of the Registrant or its stockholders for monetary damages for breach of fiduciary duty as a director, except in cases where the director breached his or her duty of loyalty to the Registrant or its stockholders, failed to act in good faith, engaged in intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of the law, willfully or negligently

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authorized the unlawful payment of a dividend or approved an unlawful stock redemption or repurchase or obtained an improper personal benefit.

Pursuant to Subsection (a) of Section 145 of the DGCL, the Registrant's Bylaws provide that the Registrant shall indemnify and upon request advance expenses to any director or officer who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit, proceeding or claim, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative (other than an action by or in the name of the Registrant), against all liability, loss suffered and expenses (including attorney's fees and expenses), judgments, fines, penalties and amounts paid in settlement reasonably incurred in connection with such action, suit, proceeding or claim provided that the Registrant shall not be required to indemnify or advance expenses to any person in connection with any action, suit, proceeding or claim initiated by or on behalf of such person unless the initiation of such action, suit, proceeding or claim was authorized in the specific case by the Board of Directors.

Pursuant to Subsection (b) of Section 145 of the DGCL, the Registrant's Bylaws provide that the Registrant shall indemnify and upon request advance expenses to any director or officer who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit, proceeding or claim by or in the right of the Registrant to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that such person acted in any of the capacities set forth above, against all expenses (including attorney's fees and expenses), reasonably incurred in connection with the investigation, preparation to defend or defense of such action, suit, proceeding or claim provided that the Registrant shall not be required to indemnify or advance expenses to any person in connection with any action, suit, proceeding or claim initiated by or on behalf of such person.

The Registrant's Bylaws further provide that, to the extent that a director or officer has been successful in the defense of any action, suit or proceeding referred to in subsections (a) and (b) of Section 145 of the DGCL or in the defense of any claim, issue or matter therein, he shall be indemnified against expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection therewith. Any person seeking indemnification as described above shall be deemed to have met the standard of conduct required for such indemnification unless the contrary shall be established. The indemnification provided by Section 145 of the DGCL shall not be exclusive of any other rights to which the party seeking indemnification may be entitled.

Section 145 of the DGCL also provides that a corporation is empowered to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of a director, officer, employee or agent of the corporation against any liability asserted against him or her or incurred by him or her in any such capacity or arising out of his or her status as such whether or not the corporation would have the power to indemnify him or her against such liabilities under Section 145 of the DGCL. The Registrant has purchased certain liability insurance for its officers and directors.

The Registrant has entered into indemnification agreements with its directors and certain of its executive officers and certain of its executive officers' employment agreements contain indemnification provisions. Such agreements and provisions generally provide that such persons will be indemnified and held harmless to the fullest extent of Delaware law.

(a) The undersigned Registrant hereby undertakes:

(1) To file, during any period in which offers or sales are being made, a post-effective amendment to this Registration Statement:

(i) to include any prospectus required by Section 10(a)(3) of the Securities Act of 1933, as amended (the Securities Act);

(ii) to reflect in the prospectus any facts or events arising after the effective date of the Registration Statement (or the most recent post-effective amendment thereof) which, individually or in the aggregate, represent a fundamental change in the information set forth in the Registration Statement; and

(iii) to include any material information with respect to the plan of distribution not previously disclosed in the Registration Statement or any material change to such information in the Registration Statement.

Provided, however, that the undertakings set forth in paragraphs (a)(1)(i) and (a)(1)(ii) do not apply if the information required to be included in a post-effective amendment by those paragraphs is contained in periodic reports filed by the Registrant pursuant to Section 13 or Section 15(d) of the Exchange Act that are incorporated by reference in this Registration Statement.

(2) That, for the purpose of determining any liability under the Securities Act, each such post-effective amendment shall be deemed to be a new registration statement relating to the securities offered therein, and the offering of such securities at that time shall be deemed to be the initial bona fide offering thereof; and

(3) To remove from registration by means of a post-effective amendment any of the securities being registered that remain unsold at the termination of the offering.

(b) The undersigned Registrant hereby further undertakes that, for purposes of determining any liability under the Securities Act, each filing of the Registrant's annual report pursuant to Section 13(a) or 15(d) of the Exchange Act that is incorporated by reference in the Registration Statement shall be deemed to be a new registration statement relating to the securities offered therein, and the offering of such securities at that time shall be deemed to be the initial bona fide offering thereof.

(c) Insofar as indemnification for liabilities arising under the Securities Act may be permitted to directors, officers and controlling persons of the Registrant pursuant to the foregoing provisions, or otherwise, the Registrant has been advised that in the opinion of the Commission such indemnification is against public policy as expressed in the Securities Act and is, therefore, unenforceable. In the event that a claim for indemnification against such liabilities (other than the payment by the Registrant of expenses incurred or paid by a director, officer or controlling person of the Registrant in the successful defense of any action, suit or proceeding) is asserted by such director, officer or controlling person in connection with the securities being registered, the Registrant will, unless in the opinion of its counsel the

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matter has been settled by controlling precedent, submit to a court of appropriate jurisdiction the question whether such indemnification by it is against public policy as expressed in the Securities Act and will be governed by the final adjudication of such issue.

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Know all men by these presents, that each person whose signature appears below constitutes and appoints David P. Steiner, Robert G. Simpson and Rick L Wittenbraker, and each of them, each of whom may act without joinder of the other, his true and lawful attorneys-in-fact and agents, with full power of substitution and resubstitution, for him and in his name, place and stead, in any and all capacities, to sign any or all pre- or post-effective amendments to this Registration Statement, including without limitation any registration statement of the type contemplated by Rule 462(b) under the Securities Act of 1933, as amended, and to file the same, with all exhibits thereto and other documents in connection therewith, with the Securities and Exchange Commission, granting unto said attorneys-in-fact and agents, and each of them, full power and authority to do and perform each and every act and thing requisite and necessary to be done in and about the premises, as fully to all intents and purposes as he might or could do in person, hereby ratifying and confirming all that said attorneys-in-fact and agents, and each of them, or substitute or substitutes of any or all of them, may lawfully do or cause to be done by virtue hereof.
